Tuesday, 23rd –Grammar practice: Passive report structures.

Formal (passive) **It was thought that** the world was flat.

Bananas are said to give you energy.

Informal (active) **People thought that** world was flat.

They say that bananas give you energy.

Do exercises 1 and 2 page 80.

When reporting what people consider(ed) to be true, it's often easier to drop the "people", especially if you don't care which people. If you are writing a formal spoken, it's more appropriate.

1) Subject+ is/was/are/were+ past participle of reporting verb + infinitive.

Ex: Chocolate is thought to bad your skin.

2) It+ is/was +past participle of reporting verb +that+ subject phrase.

Ex: It's said that reading in a dim light can damage your eyes.



Homework: Practice passive voice with this sentence (Jennifer writes a romantic letter). At least 5 tenses "aspects"

Wednesday, 24th –Reading and Grammar.

You have to read "Surgery changed my life" and complete using had/have or having.

Grammar: Have/ get something done.

We use have something done to mean another person does a service for us.

The grammar for this is simple:

Have/get + object + past participle



Mandy cut her hair last week (she cut it herself)

Mandy had her hair cut last week (someone cut it for her)

It's the contrary to fact.

For example:

(a) If I taught this class, I wouldn't give tests. In (a) In truth, I don't teach this class.

(b) If he were here right now, he would help us. In (b) In truth, He is not here right now.

(c) If I were you, I would accept their invitation. In (c) In truth, I am not you.

NOTE: **WERE** is used for both singular and plural subjects. **WAS** (with I, he, she, it) is sometimes used in informal speech: If I was you, I'd accept their invitation.
